

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SYNOPSIS

Jacqueline (Cynthia Erivo), a young refugee, lands alone and penniless on a Greek island, where she tries first to survive and then to cope with her past. While gathering her strength, she begins a friendship with a rootless tour-guide (Alia Shawkat) and together they find the resilience to forge ahead.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

When I was first introduced to the material, I was surprised to find myself captivated by what is mostly a "one-woman" story. Even though Alexander Maksik's novel is a work of fiction, there was a truth in its heroine that felt utterly human and honest. It moved and haunted me in equal measure.

At the heart of Drift is Jacqueline, she is a refugee from Liberia, landing upon the beaches of Greece, putting up a daily fight to survive. But she is not your usual refugee. She comes from a position of privilege, having enjoyed the power and comforts of establishment and now fallen from grace. Jacqueline struggles to belong, to define her very own existence.

For Jacqueline, both her mind and body are constantly at drift. This slowly changes when she meets a tour guide Callie, a complete stranger. They save one another.

I have always been fascinated by the bonds and intimate connections struck between strangers and it reaffirms my belief that sometimes the people that can lift you up the most are not always the people who are closest to you.

This theme of complex bonds between strangers is actually one I keep coming back to in all my films. It never fails to move me, and constantly restores my faith in humanity.

DIRECTOR - Anthony Chen

Anthony Chen is an award-winning writer, director and producer from Singapore. His debut feature Ilo Ilo (2013) was awarded the Caméra d'Or at the Cannes Film Festival. His sophomore film Wet Season(2019) was nominated for the Platform Prize at the Toronto International Film Festival. In 2021, he contributed a short to the anthology film The Year of the Everlasting Storm, which premiered at Cannes. Drift marks his English-language debut.

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CAST – Cynthia Erivo / Jacqueline

Cynthia Erivo is a Grammy® Emmy® and Tony® Award-winning actress, singer, author and producer, as well as an Academy Award®, Golden Globe®, and SAG nominee. Since bursting onto the West End and Broadway stages in "The Color Purple," she has taken the world by storm.

Erivo is currently in production on Universal's film adaptation of the hit musical WICKED, where she will star as Elphaba opposite Ariana Grande's Glinda in the highly anticipated

film from director Jon M. Chu. She was most recently seen starring in Disney+'s PINOCCHIO as the Blue Fairy opposite Tom Hanks, Keegan Michael Key and Luke Evans. The film was released on September 8, 2022. She will next be seen in Netflix's LUTHER where she will star alongside Idris Elba and Andy Serkis in the feature film installment, which continues the story of the acclaimed BBC crime series.

Erivo has received widespread critical acclaim for work including two Academy her Awards nominations. two Golden Globe nominations and a Grammy Award nomination for her portrayal of Harriet Tubman in 2019's HARRIET in addition to lending her voice to the movie's title song, "Stand Up," for which she co-wrote. Erivo also received SAG and Emmy Award nominations for her portrayal of Aretha Franklin in National Geographic's Emmy®-winning global anthology series "Genius: Aretha."



In addition to her illustrious acting career, Erivo is a Grammy®-nominated songwriter and performer, often headlining sold-out shows, symphonies, and music spaces including the Kennedy Center Honors, the 2020 Academy Awards®, the 2017 Governor's Ball and the 2017 Grammy® Awards. Erivo released her debut album, Ch. 1 Vs. 1, with Verve/Universal Music Group on September 17, 2021.

On top of all of that, Erivo added 'Author' to her title in the fall of 2021 with the release of her first children's book titled, "Remember to Dream, Ebere." The book follows a young girl named Ebere whose mother encourages her to dream as big as possible. Erivo wrote the book as an ode to a child's imagination, a parent's love and the big dreams shared by both.

In August 2020, Erivo launched her production company, Edith's Daughter, and announced her first-look deal with MRC Television & Civic Center Media. Edith's Daughter focuses on projects that express the beauty in the stories and people who are often overlooked and underrepresented. Erivo named Solome Williams as Vice President of the company. Under the Edith's Daughter banner, Erivo will star in and produce DRIFT, which follows a young Liberian refugee named Jacqueline (Erivo) who has barely escaped her war-torn country to a Greek island. The film is currently in post-production and expected to hit the festival circuit in 2023.

CAST - Alia Shawkat / Callie

Success arrived early for Alia Shawkat, and she continues to establish herself as a highly sought-after actress in both film and television. On television, for five seasons she starred in and produced the HBO Max hit genre-bending mystery comedy "Search Party." The show, which premiered at the 2016 SXSW Film Festival as part of the Official TV Selection category, garnered Shawkat much critical praise for her performance as the shows lead "Dory Shief." In the series fourth season, she also directed an episode. Shawkat was most recently seen in the new FX series, "The Old Man," opposite Jeff Bridges and John Lithgow. She portrays "Angela Adams," a rising star at the FBI who is swept into a world of buried secrets and hidden agendas that will put her relationships to the test. Once again receiving critical praise, Decider said about her performance "Decades ago, Arrested



Development taught us all that Alia Shawkat is a straight up comedic force. It's time for us to recognize that the main reason why Maeby's elaborate lies and Dory's withering glares work aren't just because of their actor's delivery. They work because Shawkat can sell anything — comedy, drama, and everything in between." She is currently in production on the second season of the Emmy nominated Apple TV+ series "Severance" from Executive Producer Ben Stiller.

In 2022, Shawkat completed production on two feature films - Zoe Kravitz's directorial debut for MGM Pussy Island and DRIFT opposite Academy Award nominee Cynthia Erivo. In Pussy Island, she stars opposite Channing Tatum and Naomi Ackie in the film about a young waitress who sets her eyes on a handsome tech mogul and eventually gets sucked into his world and is invited to an intimate gathering on a private island where she gets the sense that something isn't right. Drift, which is Anthony Chen's English-language debut,

follows a young Liberian refugee named Jacqueline (Erivo) who has barely escaped her war-torn country to a Greek island. She offers massages to tourists in exchange for one or two euros to battle her hunger, while her daily struggle for survival keeps the memories that haunt her at bay. She meets an unmoored tour guide (Shawkat) and the two become close as they each find hope in the other. Shawkat was most recently seen in Amazon Studios' critically acclaimed feature film Being the Ricardos from Academy Awards winner writer/director Aaron Sorkin. Alia starred opposite Nicole Kidman and Javier Bardem as legendary "I Love Lucy" writer "Madelyn Pugh." She also starred alongside Oscar Isaac in the short film, The Letter Room, from writer/director Elvira Lind. Following successful festival run, the short film went on to be nominated for an Academy Award for Best Live Action Short Film in 2021.

Shawkat's career began at the age of 11 with her feature film debut as a young Iraqi child in David O. Russell's Three Kings opposite George Clooney. In 2018, she starred opposite songwriter and musician Ben Dickey in the indie biopic Blaze. The film, directed by Ethan Hawke, tells the story of country and western songwriter Blaze Foley, and premiered in competition at the 2018 Sundance Film Festival. Shawkat also starred in the independent film Duck Butter, which she co-wrote with Miguel Arteta and executive produced alongside Arteta and the Duplass Brothers. The film premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival where she was awarded Best Actress in a U.S. Narrative Feature Film. Her additional feature credits include: the independent drama Animals, based on the Emma Jane Unsworth novel, Amber Tamblyn's directorial debut Paint It Black, based on the book of the same name by "White Oleander" author Janet Fitch, Netflix's Original Film Pee-Wee's Big Holiday produced by Paul Reubens and Judd Apatow and indie thriller Green Room alongside Anton Yelchin, Imogen Poots and Sir Patrick Stewart, Mike Mills' 20th Century Women, Clea DuVall's directorial debut The Intervention, Adam Green's Aladdin, comedic indie thriller The Final Girls, Sebastian Silva's Nasty Baby (which she co-produced), The Oranges opposite Allison Janney, Oliver Platt and Hugh Laurie, Cedar Rapids directed by Miguel Arteta, Drew Barrymore's directorial debut Whip It opposite Ellen Page and Cherien Dabis' Amreeka, which debuted at the Sundance Film Festival, among others.

Well known for her role of "Maeby Funke" on FOX's Emmy Award winning cult comedy series "Arrested Development," Shawkat recently revisited the role with all new episodes of the series for Netflix. She played a prominent role in the fourth season of Jill Soloway's critically acclaimed Amazon series, "Transparent," and will return for the show's two-hour series finale. Shawkat was recently seen on the small screen guest-starring on the Emmy nominated "Drunk History," IFC's "Portlandia," Comedy Central's "Broad City" and in a recurring role on HBO's "Getting On."
