




turn to America after living over twenty years in Latin America, North Africa, Paris, and London.



It brought together icons such as Patti Smith, Frank Zappa, Laurie Anderson, Philip Glass, Allen Ginsberg, Merce Cunningham, John Cage, and many more. A cultural time capsule on the enduring power of creative freedom, the footage captures backstage moments, candid encounters, and raw performances at the heart of the downtown scene.

Originally shot on 16mm by filmmaker Howard Brookner and long considered lost, the footage also marked the beginning of his cult classic **Burroughs: The Movie.**

Directors' Biographies

Aaron Brookner is an American-British writer, director, producer, and visual artist, born in New York City and based in London since 2009. He studied film at Vassar College and began his career assisting on Jim Jarmusch's Coffee and Cigarettes and Rebecca Miller's Personal Velocity, before directing the award-winning documentary short The Black Cowboys (2004).

Brookner wrote an authorised screenplay based on the life of legendary writer Budd Schulberg and began a feature documentary with him, which remained unfinished due to Schulberg's passing in 2009. His first feature film The Silver Goat (2012) was the first ever made exclusively for iPad and released as an app. It was downloaded in 24 countries and ranked among the top 50 entertainment apps in the UK and Czech Republic.

In 2011, he launched the recovery and restoration of the work and archive of his late uncle, director Howard Brookner. This led to the acclaimed restoration of the cult documentary Burroughs: The Movie (1983), featuring William S. Burroughs, which screened in the 2014 New York Film Festival Revivals section with Jim Jarmusch, Tom DiCillo, and James Grauerholz in attendance. The film was distributed by Janus Films and is part of the prestigious Criterion Collection.

In 2014, he created his first video installation, Double-Breasted Trench, for the William S. Burroughs centenary.

His visual artworks have since been exhibited at the Museum of Modern Art in Tallinn and the Centre of Contemporary Culture of Barcelona (CCCB).

He has worked across narrative and documentary for over two decades. Selected works include directing Uncle Howard (Sundance, Berlinale), co-writing and producing Listen (Venice, 2020), and co-producing Diciannove (Venice, TIFF 2024). He leads the Howard Brookner Legacy Project. His latest release is 1986's Robert Wilson & the CIVIL warS at Bologna's Cinema Ritrovato in 2025.



Rodrigo Areias is a film director and producer. He began his professional life as a musician and music producer at the label Garagem and as Sound Designer in cinema working for directors such as Paulo Rocha and Edgar Pêra. He studied Management at the Portuguese Catholic University and graduated in Sound and Image at the School of Arts. He took a specialisation in film Direction at Tisch School of Arts at NYU and attended the "Production Eurodoc Program" and "Venice Biennale College".

In his early career, he developed creative work in fiction and documentary, video art and video clips for some of the best bands in the Portuguese rock scene (The Legendary Tiger Man, Wray Gunn, Mão Morta, Sean Riley and the Slow Riders, etc.).

Areias has directed 8 feature films and several shorts that have been awarded in more than 40 festivals, including Karlovy Vary (Hay Road). His latest feature documentary, Blue Breath, premiered in Locarno FF First Look and won the Festivals of Ismailia, Pristina and Kalajoki.

Since 2001 he has produced and co-produced over 150 short and feature films including fiction, documentaries, and animation, by international directors such as FJ Ossang, Gabe Klinger, Teddy Williams, Lois Patiño and Matias Piñeiro, and the Portuguese Edgar Pêra, João Canijo, Ana Rocha de Sousa and André Gil Mata.

As a producer he won a Golden Lion in Venice and a Golden Leopard in Locarno. His productions premiered in the most important festivals: Cannes, Berlin, Venice, Rotterdam, Locarno, Clermont Ferrand, Annecy.

He was responsible for the Guimarães 2012 European Capital of Culture film production and produced the films of Jean-Luc Godard, Aki Kaurismaki, Peter Greenaway, Manoel de Oliveira, Pedro Costa and Victor Erice, among many others.

Directors' Statements

On Valentine's Day, 2022, I received a message from an archivist at the John Giorno Foundation: more boxes of my uncle Howard Brookner's films had been discovered.

I was stunned. For years, I had fought to access Howard's archive, locked away for three decades in William S. Burroughs' former New York City home, "The Bunker". When I finally succeeded in 2013, I uncovered a massive cache of material, including 183 original camera negatives Howard shot between 1978 and 1982 while creating his feature documentary, Burroughs: The Movie (1983).

Thanks to an early Kickstarter crowdfunding campaign, generous donors, and the Criterion Collection, Burroughs: The Movie was restored and re-premiered at the New York Film Festival in 2014. My journey to uncover Howard's legacy and his extensive film archive became my own feature documentary, Uncle Howard, premiering at Sundance in 2016.

Yet, despite these discoveries, 44 negative rolls from Howard's years filming with Burroughs remained missing. After exhausting every possibility, I had reluctantly accepted their loss, until that unexpected message in 2022. Miraculously, the newly discovered boxes contained precisely these 44 rolls.

Before creating Burroughs: The Movie as a definitive biographical portrait, Howard had assembled multiple camera crews to document the legendary Nova Convention, an extraordinary three-day celebration of William Burroughs held in 1978. The newly recovered film rolls revealed unseen performances, intimate conversations, and precious audience interactions, capturing the event's groundbreaking atmosphere and the profound cultural moment it represented.

Nova '78 immerses viewers in the vibrant energy and transformative ideas of 1978, a cultural high-water mark for artistic expression, gender equality, gay rights, human rights, and environmental awareness. Shaping this rich archive into a compelling narrative for contemporary audiences has been both challenging and profoundly rewarding. I'm deeply grateful to my long-time producer, Paula Vaccaro, and my fellow director, Rodrigo Areias, whose belief in the potency of this material and our storytelling approach has remained unwavering.

Of all the gifts my uncle's archive has given me, perhaps the greatest has been the ability to travel through time, to experience a New York City that existed before I was born, and to engage directly with some of our boldest artists and thinkers. With Nova '78, I invite today's audiences to join this remarkable journey, to rediscover, and discover, the excitement, creativity, and enduring spirit of The Nova Convention.

Aaron Brookner

When Aaron Brookner invited me to co-direct a film using the extraordinary archive Howard Brookner filmed in the late 1970s with William S. Burroughs, I was already familiar with Burroughs: The Movie and Aaron's Uncle Howard. The opportunity to immerse myself in this remarkable material, filled with iconic figures from an era of American culture that greatly influenced me, was irresistible.

In this dive, my main concern was to respect the author of the images and those involved, trying to maintain their roughness, the out of focus, the zooms looking for something, the clap boards... the nature of a film that is assuming to be using images that were shot with a purpose.

The challenge was to reveal images that deserve to be seen, without adding modern explanations or placing them within a fixed historical frame. My aim was to let them convey the energy of their time, as a reminder of a fierce creative utopia and a vivid portrait of a New York that has vanished.

Through this time capsule, I want audiences to recall what it meant, politically and artistically, to be creative at the start of the 1980s, when Donald Trump was only beginning to emerge on the public stage.

The film carries a Burroughsian belief that literature should move from the time continuum into the spatial one. It anticipates a political shift that is still urgently needed, and the dystopia he foresaw is now part of our everyday reality.
